Welcome to the winter edition of the Lifelong Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) Network Newsletter

In the midst of the busy lead up to the festive season, we take stock of what we have achieved together as a Network. In this edition, we will be sharing updates on what we have been up to over the last 6 months including our in-person network meeting held in September and an introduction from David Barron, our new Chief of Cardiac Surgery.

This time reminds us not only that we are nearing the end of this calendar year, but also the end of the first 3year board term as the Lifelong CHD Network. We know there is a degree of uncertainty with NHS England integrating into the Department for Health and Social Care, however as a Network, we remain committed with business as usual. Wheels are in motion for a new board term to commence in April 2026.

Our network centre visits have been very productive and we have enjoyed getting acquainted with centres some of us may not have known before the merger between the GSTT-ELCH and the RBH CHD Networks. With a handful of the Paediatric and Adult visits to complete, we also undertook our first Fetal network centre visit just this month.

Another first is the creation of the new ACHD Working group. We were pleased to be able to meet and set out plans for how the group will best run moving forward. This is open to all ACHD professionals in the Network. First meeting taking place on Wednesday 10 December 16:00-17:00 on MS Teams.

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A few words from our new Chief of Cardiac Surgery



New Chief of Cardiac Surgery, St Thomas', Evelina Children's and Royal Brompton Congenital Heart Programmes

It is a great pleasure to find myself back at St Thomas' and the Royal Brompton, where I spent many happy years during my training. The congenital heart services at these two great institutions have been brought together into a combined programme which allows us to share our expertise and facilities across both sites in central London. My appointment began in February 2025, having spent 6 years running the service in Toronto at the Sick Kids Hospital and Toronto General, which are the leading paediatric and ACHD units in Canada. Prior to this I was a consultant in Birmingham for 20 years.

These are exciting times for the service, as we are now the largest Congenital Heart Programme in the UK and can utilise all the skills and expertise from both units to strengthen the breadth and quality of the clinical service, as well as combining our research work, training and education. It provides more flexibility to create more facilities for our patients and better access for both in-patient and out-patient treatment.

I look forward to joining your Network Days and helping strengthen the links across all of our regions.

Hot Topic

Adult and Paediatric Psychology have been featured in our July and October meetings respectively, with patient journeys to illustrate some of the challenges faced. Michèle Puckey, Paediatric Clinical Psychology Lead provided an overview of the service and how to refer. This is especially important as data suggests CHD patients are 2-3x more likely to suffer from anxiety and depression.

The demand for psychology support continues to grow. To understand where psychological support is needed, the Network Management Team (NMT) have been tasked to undertake a mapping exercise of adult and paediatric psychology provision in the network.

End of current term approaches

As the board approaches the end of its current 3-year term, the draft version of the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the new term (April 26-March 29) has now been approved. Amendments to the new ToR includes increasing the number of Level 2 and Level 3 board positions. Expressions of Interest will be sought in January 2026, ready for the new term to start in April.



Chaired by Dr Tosin Otunla, Ashford & St. Peter's PEC and also our Network PEC on the board



It was agreed that the frequency of these meetings be reduced to three per year, with the aim that one of these will be in-person and incorporated into a PEC Study day. The format of the study day is to be decided, but suggestions so far include a mixture of education, learning from case studies, L1 updates and management discussions. If you have some other ideas, please let us know.

Under PEC Rajesh Gabani's supervision, Saduf Karim Sulaiman (ST4 at Lewisham & Greenwich), presented her excellent and concise ECG Guidelines. This will now be forwarded to the Electrophysiology leads for review, before being made available to all. A reminder that these are guidelines only.

Some PECs have put themselves forward to assist Tosin in working on Network Guidelines for referring to PEC clinics so this work can start in earnest soon.

"Mind the Gap" ECG Project





The study showed that **simple, focused teaching** can significantly boost ECG confidence and supports including regular ECG training in both undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.

A national survey of 270 clinicians and medical students revealed a clear gap between confidence and competence in paediatric and neonatal ECG interpretation.

Main barriers: fear of missing a diagnosis, lack of practice and low confidence.

Preferred learning: case-based teaching, short ECG modules and quick reference guides.

Janet Rathburn, Chair of the Northwest, North Wales and Isle of Man CHD Network, kindly gave up some of her time to meet with Sean, Jane, Andrea and Kate. She shared her experience with setting up their PPV group which is now more established and grown to 14 members, meeting on a monthly basis.

It was reassuring to learn that they also found recruiting new members a challenge and that the approaches our PPVs have tried to attracting new members were largely aligned.

Janet has invited our reps to attend one of their working group meetings for observance which we hope to arrange in the very near future.

Heart to Heart: QE Hospital (Woolwich)/ Darent Valley Hospital Study Day

More than 30 participants attended a successful regional paediatric cardiac study day held at Queen Elizabeth Hospital (Woolwich) on 29 August 2025. This was jointly organised by Tessa Shewan, Children's Nurse with an interest in Cardiology (Darent Valley Hospital) and Charley Weston, Practice Development Nurse (Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Woolwich) and supported by the Lead Nurses from the Lifelong CHD Network. The aim of the event was to increase the knowledge and skills of local nurses and Allied Health Professionals to care for cardiac patients presenting at local hospitals and its community.

The programme covered fetal and post-natal circulation, septal defects, coarctation of aorta, tetralogy of Fallot, hypoplastic left heart syndrome, psychology considerations in congenital heart disease and transition (moving from paediatric to adult services). A mother shared their experience with her son's diagnosis and living with a heart condition which was very moving.

Rothschild and Co and the Evelina London Charity Scholarship award

In a previous newsletter, we shared the good news that Lynda Shaughnessy and Susana De Sousa were awarded a scholarship providing financial support and mentorship for their project titled 'Transition provision: a holistic approach'. It aims to look at how to ensure transition services develop to provide all the needs for the patient, reducing the numbers of appointments and preventing lost to follow-up when moving from paediatric to adult services.

Transition provision: a holistic approach

- Address complex healthcare transition for Young People (YP) with cardiac conditions and other co-morbidities
- Deep dive to the services currently provided in acute and community settings
- Design a service along with the young people to ensure that services are working together to provide truly holistic and joined up care.



Currently in phase 1, they are collecting and reviewing data on patients with Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome born since 1995 to identify which services they may also require other than cardiology when moving from paediatric to adult services. This update was presented at a Rothschild event in London on 06 November. Watch this space for more updates soon.
