## Welcome to the summer edition of the Lifelong Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) Network Newsletter

## Where are the new Paediatric Wards?

Going to a hospital appointment can be very confusing even when you have been given directions, so Ilin Hayter (Business Support Manager) and Naomi Nicolae (Assistant Network Manager) of the Lifelong CHD Network Management Team took a walk to see if signage was easy to follow and the wards were easy to locate.

### Inpatients – Edward Ward, 10<sup>th</sup> Floor, North Wing, St Thomas' Hospital

#### Directions from the main entrance of St Thomas' Hospital

Turn right at the main reception of St Thomas' Hospital, then left into North Wing (green zone). Take the "A" lift up to the 10th floor and follow signs for Edward ward.

### Outpatients – Galaxy, Children's Day Treatment Centre, 4<sup>th</sup> Floor, North Wing, St Thomas' Hospital

#### Directions from the main entrance of St Thomas' Hospital

Turn right at the main reception of St Thomas' Hospital, then left through North Wing (green zone). As you approach South Wing (purple zone), you will see overhead signage for Children's Day Treatment Centre directing you to take the first left near Governors' Hall. Take the patient lift straight up to level 4 Galaxy Outpatients, which is located within the Children's Day Treatment Centre. *Please note this is not to be confused with the Children's Day Surgery Unit entrance.*

# Board Meeting Update



The inaugural board meeting for 2026-29 took place in-person on 21 April 2026. Thank you to all members for any changes in their diaries to accommodate this. It is anticipated that one meeting per year will be face to face to provide an opportunity for members to meet.

The board membership has been increased from 26 to 31 allowing more representation from the 45 centres across our Network. The first meeting set out some of the expectations and ways of working of the board, including the role of the Network Management Team (NMT) which is to facilitate the work of the CHD Network on communication, pathways and governance to improve patient care. Items on the agenda will be reduced to support more discussion time and actions from previous meetings will be regularly reviewed.

As with the previous term, each meeting will begin with a patient journey to remind us of why we are part of our Network and of the work we do. It also ensures that person or patient-centered care remains the focal point of all strategic and operational decisions.

## Commissioner Update:

NHS England (NHSE) will be brought into the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) by April 2027. Colleagues in specialised commissioning will be transferred to the new Offices of Pan-integrated Care Board (ICB) Commissioning (OPIC).

# Working Group Updates

## ACHD Working Group

Chaired by Dr Natali Chung, Lifelong CHD Network Clinical Director

### ACHD CNS Working Group

L2 and L3 ACHD CNSs meet with our Network lead nurses every two months to share best practices, generate ideas for new projects and reflect on both challenges and success. They are currently working on uniform replies to patients/GP queries and template letters (e.g. ADHD, weight loss injection, vaccination, travel information etc.) and will share these at the next meeting and be approved by the working group.

### ACHD Network & Education Day, Friday 16 October 2026 Registration will be open soon

This day has been confirmed to take place at the Heart and Lung Research Institute, Cambridge. This will be an in-person all day event and we are grateful to our colleagues at The Royal Papworth Hospital for assisting us with a venue. Thank you to those who have responded to the Save the Date that has been sent to adult colleagues so we can gauge numbers. A registration form will need to be completed to secure a space as places are limited and we will share this soon. Meanwhile, the programme is being discussed.

### Other updates

- Natali Chung continues to chair these meetings on an interim basis until such time that a colleague would like to take on this role.
- Discharge of post device closure ASDs Guideline has been drafted by Ioannis Kasouridis, Consultant Cardiologist at Brighton and awaiting review from the group
- Toni Hardiman, ACHD Consultant Nurse at Norfolk & Norwich, presented results of an Endocarditis Prophylaxis survey to assess what current advice is being given to patients around antibiotic prophylaxis (AP). Results revealed there is much variation across the network including advice provided by various national guidelines and paediatric, adult and dentists following different guidelines.
